NEW Governing Documents

The 5th Amended and Restated Declaration of Restrictive Covenants

It is hard to believe but, it has been 13 years since the Developer recorded the 4th Amended and Restated Declaration of Restrictive Covenants, essentially conveying his rights and authority to the association and its membership. Since that time, there have been several areas of the documents that needed to be updated or amended.

The developer approved and signed off on the 5th Amended and Restated Declaration of Restrictive Covenants on December 1st and they have been recorded with the Recorder of Deeds office of both Camden and Miller counties.

The most significant changes to the documents include modifications to the replat procedures and the coordinating assessment for replatted properties, an allowance for the possibility of having a seven-member Board of Directors if warranted and a provision to amend the governing documents in the future. There were additional minor changes as well that each property owner should familiarize themselves with. Noise Nusiance

The loudest noise in recorded history occurred in 1883, when the Krakatoa volcano exploded.

Try telling that to someone who lives close to a barking dog. As anyone who has been awakened at 3:00 a.m. can attest, barking dogs can be an incredible annoyance. To make matters worse, they rarely bark once. While the Krakatoa eruption was certainly loud – it was heard nearly 3,000 miles away – the explosion was fast and furious. By contrast, barking dogs tend to bark constantly, often in the middle of the night.

The Property Owners Association (POA) Management Office has received many complaints about barking dogs and dogs running loose. Every owner has the right of "quiet enjoyment" such as sleep and taking a walk without fear of being bitten or intimidated by a loose dog. Unconfined dogs, outside of their owner's control, will be subject to a fine and the offending dog may be impounded or possibly euthanized.

If you have a dog, please be considerate of your neighbors by keeping the dog under your control at all times. If your dog continually barks, please keep it inside your house to prevent the barking from becoming a nuisance. Four Seasons Private Lakes Stocked For Fishing

Available to Four Seasons Property Owners only, the fishing lakes are stocked with Catfish, Rockbass, and Bluegill. You must obtain a fishing license before using the lakes.



Where Are The Lakes?

Autumn Lake: Take Horseshoe bend Parkway (State Road HH), turn right on Cherokee Road. Follow Cherokee, turn left onto Linn Creek. Follow Linn Creek Road, turn left on Cornett Branch Road. Stay on Cornett Branch, turn right on Cornett Drive. Take Cornell Drive to Autumn Lake Drive, turn left on Autumn Lake Drive. Stay on left Autumn Lake Drive and turn right onto the gravel road. There is a sign labeled Autumn Lake.

Good Oak Lake: Take Horseshoe bend Parkway (State Road HH), turn right on Cherokee Road. Follow Cherokee, turn left onto Linn Creek Road. Follow Linn Creek Road and turn left onto Cornell Branch. Take Cornett Branch to Ridge Road and turn left. The access road is on the left of Ridge Road.

<u>Treeline Lake:</u> Take Horseshoe bend Parkway (State Road HH), turn right on Bittersweet Road. Follow Bittersweet Road to Bloomington Drive and turn left. Continue straight on Bloomington Drive and it will take you directly to Treeline Lake. (Note: The access road at the end of Bloomington Drive is steep and difficult to maneuver. We suggest you park your car at the top and walk down.)

Spring Tips



Spring is the best time to:

- Trim mums to measure 8 to 10 inches around, stopping blooms to form until July 4. This will produce large, colorful, mums for the fall season.
- Prune summer blooming shrubs such as Spirea, Rose of Sharon, and Burning Bush. Barberries and evergreens such as Boxwoods can be pruned and shaped as needed throughout the year.
- Treat your lawn for grubs.
- Begin lawn fertilization to promote healthy green lawns.
- Cut your ornamental grasses down as low as you can go without cutting into the heart of the plant. Cut them straight across like a flat top haircut.



• Add nutrients to create a healthy medium for the plant to grow. You must augment your gardening areas with fertilizers and nutrients. A general fertilizer (10-10-10 or 20-20-20) and peat moss will add organic material and nitrogen. Preen (a weed killer) will not hurt the flowers and can be added to reduce weeds in your garden.

Crepe Myrtles – In early spring before they leaf out, trim your Crepe Myrtle. Avoid topping the shrub but a small amount can be trimmed for neatness and trim all the smaller branches out of the shrub. Avoid leaving nubs on the branches because they form smaller branches that will not hold up flowers.

Azaleas – Prune, transplant, and fertilize in the spring <u>after</u> the plants have flowered. Add a slow-release fertilizer such as a 12-5-9 or similar types. Prune after they have bloomed, but no later than July 4 because you will be cutting the blooms for next year.

Refreshing Your Yard This Spring?

Spring is around the corner and residents are beginning to plan for landscaping projects and lawn repairs. While repairing and refreshing your yards, please remember that waste and debris should NOT be left in ditch lines that are meant to channel water. If leaves or other yard waste are in the ditch line of your property, you may burn it if you keep the burning materials away from the pavement, as far as possible. The ACC would also like to remind everyone that the large green transformer boxes near the road must be free of any impediments. Nothing can be placed within ten feet of the front of the transformer or within three feet of the other sides. Please remember this when updating your landscaping this spring and summer. All landscape projects require permits! Please contact the administrative staff of the ACC, they will be happy to answer any questions regarding permits: 573-552-8334.

Types of Sewer Systems in the Four Seasons POA

There are three types of sewer treatment systems utilized within the Four Seasons POA. The first, and most common, is an individual on-site wastewater treatment system. These systems consist of an aerated treatment unit (ATU) and a drain-field for the treated effluent to be dispersed. The second is a grinder pump system, which uses a grinder pump to pump sewage into a pressurized central sewer line. The third type, of which there are very few, is a gravity system which relies on gravity to move sewage to a pressurized central sewer line.

The type of system you have depends entirely on where within the POA you live. The majority of individual onsite wastewater treatment systems are located in the Horseshoe Bend area. There are a few homes in the Horseshoe Bend area that utilize grinder pump systems and an even smaller number of homes and town homes that have gravity systems.

In contrast, the majority of grinder pump systems are located in the Porto Cima area of the POA. However, there are 21 homes in the Porto Cima area that utilize aerated treatment systems combined with effluent pumps to pump the treated effluent into the pressurized central sewer line. There is also a very small number of town homes in the Porto Cima area that have gravity systems.

Each of the different systems has its own unique maintenance requirements. There are also different types of onsite treatment systems and each has its own specific requirements. If you are not sure which type of system you have, call the Environmental Services Dept. at 573-552-8334 and they will be able to tell you.


