Based on input from property owners who have expressed their opinions, the Board decided that a new Pickle Ball facility would serve the majority of owners the best. As we began the process of preparing the site for redevelopment, it became evident that substantial work would be required to stabilize the site for the intended use. We apologize for the delay; however, we want to ensure that, once developed, owners will have a safe and pleasant experience using this wonderful amenity.

During the February 19th Board of Directors meeting, the Board authorized the removal of the old concrete pool deck surface in order to allow for a better understanding of what is going on underneath. Once this work is completed, a better sense of the necessary work can be determined. Once that process is complete, the Board can better assess the expense of the project and make an informed decision as to what funds will be required and what options are available.

Spring Tips

Spring is the best time to:

- Trim mums to measure 8 to 10-inches around, stopping blooms to form until July 4. This will produce large, colorful mums for the fall season.
- Prune summer blooming shrubs such as Spirea, Rose of Sharon, and Burning bushes. Barberries and evergreens such as Boxwoods can be pruned and shaped as needed throughout the year.
- Treat your lawn for grubs.
- Begin lawn fertilization to promote healthy green lawns.
- Cut your ornamental grasses down as low as you can go without cutting into the heart of the plant. Cut them straight across like a flat top haircut.
- Add nutrients to create a healthy medium for the plant to grow. You must augment your gardening areas with fertilizers and nutrients. A general fertilizer (10-10-10 or 20-20-20) and peat moss will add organic material and nitrogen. Preen (a weed killer) will not hurt the flowers and can be added to reduce weeds in your garden.

Crepe Myrtles – In early spring, before they leaf out, trim your Crepe Myrtle. Avoid topping the shrub, but a small amount can be trimmed for neatness and trim all the smaller branches out of the shrub. Avoid leaving nubs on the branches because they form smaller branches that will not hold up flowers.

Azaleas – Prune, transplant, and fertilize in the spring, <u>after</u> the plants have flowered. Add a slow-release fertilizer such as a 12-5-9 or similar types. Prune after they have bloomed, but no later than July 4 because you will be cutting the blooms for next year.



ACC Update

Spring is coming and residents are starting to plan for landscaping projects and landscaping repairs. While repairing and straightening up your yards, please remember that no debris should be left within the ditch lines. Should you place leaves or other yard waste within the ditch lines, please burn it while keeping the burning materials as far from the pavement as possible. The ACC would also like to remind everyone that the large green transformer boxes near the road must be free of any impediments. Nothing can be placed within ten feet (10') of the front of the transformer or within three feet (3') of the other sides. Please remember this when planning your landscaping this Spring and Summer.

Finally, these landscaping projects <u>require</u> permits. The administrative staff of the ACC will be happy to help with any questions regarding permits. Please call 573-552-8334.

Let's Talk Trash (Enclosures)!

Please check your trash enclosure for damage from weather. Owner Services has found some trash enclosures are in need of power washing, painting, or a complete make over this spring.

Trash enclosure permits are free to obtain, just call 573-552-8334 to request a permit. If you are not able to pick up the permit, Owner Services will post the permit for you. Thank you for maintaining your trash enclosures this spring!

Spring Rains and Your Wastewater System

Spring is fast approaching and while we all welcome the warmer temperatures, we must be mindful of the frequent rains that typically accompany them and the effect that can have on your wastewater treatment system. With this in mind, we would like to stress the importance of keeping the lids to your wastewater treatment system exposed and accessible. If the lid or lids to your system (depending on the type you have) are not exposed, then the run-off caused by frequent and/or heavy rains can enter the system. What this means for homes with grinder pump systems is that the pump may have to run more frequently as the runoff enters the tank, possibly shortening the life of the motor. For homes with onsite treatment systems, this means the drain field may become saturated more quickly as runoff enters the tank increasing the load on the system and potentially causing the drain field to fail. Both of these situations can result in costly repair bills. To avoid these problems, we recommend that lids be exposed at least six-inches (6") from the top of the lid on grinder pump systems and at least six-inches (6") from the bottom edge of the lid for onsite systems. 
April Gardens
